

VOTING ASSISTANCE INFORMATION FOR LOCAL CIVILIAN PERSONNEL



Your Installation Voter Assistance Office is here to help you exercise the very right you protect—your right to vote! We can help you register to vote, to ensure you receive information in a timely manner.

National Mail Voter Registration Form (NVRF): If you are a U.S. citizen who lives or has an address within the United States, you can use this application to:

- Register to vote in your State
- Report a change of name to your voter registration office
- Report a change of address to your voter registration office
- Register with a political party

*****If you are in the military (or military spouse) stationed away from home, use the Federal Postcard Application*****

How to Find Out If You Are Eligible to Register to Vote in Your State: Each State has its own laws about who may register and vote. Check the information under your State in the State Instructions. All States require that you be a United States citizen by birth or naturalization to register to vote in federal and State elections. Federal law makes it illegal to falsely claim U.S. citizenship to register to vote in any federal State, or local election. You **cannot** be registered to vote in more than one place at a time.

When to Register to Vote: Each state has its own deadline for registering to vote. Check the deadline for your State in the State instructions.

You can go online to <http://www.canivote.org>. You must follow the state-specific instructions listed for your state. They begin on page 3 of the form and are listed alphabetically by state. After filling out this form, you must sign your name where indicated and send it to your state or local election office for processing. Be sure you mail it in an envelope with the proper amount of postage.

The Installation Voter Assistance Office can help you fill in and mail off your voting materials if you need the assistance. For more information, you can also contact your **Unit Voting Assistance Counselor** in your squadron for assistance.
