

Col Melissa L. Dombrock is the Deputy Commander, 89th Airlift Wing, Joint Base Andrews, Maryland. She is responsible for worldwide special air mission airlift, logistics, aerial port and communications support for the President, Vice President, cabinet members, combatant commanders and other senior military and elected leaders as tasked by the White House, Air Force Chief of Staff and Air Mobility Command. The wing provides 24/7 alert airlift and operates an Executive Airlift Training Center and Government Network Operations Center.

Col Dombrock commissioned in 2005 from the U.S. Air Force Academy and holds a master's degree from the Naval Postgraduate School. A senior pilot with over 2,700 flight hours including 929 combat hours—she is qualified in the C-17, C-21, C-37, T-1, and T-6. She has deployed in support of Operations ENDURING FREEDOM, IRAQI FREEDOM, and DEEP FREEZE. As Commander of the 76th Airlift Squadron at Ramstein AB, she also served as airboss during OPERATION ALLIES REFUGE leading a 300% surge in airlift and the evacuation of over 35 thousand Afghans.



Prior to her current assignment, Col Dombrock served as the Deputy Division Chief and Lead Planner for Future Operations at United States Africa Command in Stuttgart, Germany.
