

Col. Christopher M. Robinson is the Commander, 89th Airlift Wing, Joint Base Andrews, Maryland. He is responsible for worldwide special air mission airlift, logistics, aerial port and communications support for the President, Vice President, cabinet members, combatant commanders, and other senior military and elected leaders as tasked by the White House, Air Force Chief of Staff and Air Mobility Command. The wing provides 24/7 alert airlift and operates an Executive Airlift Training Center and Government Security Operations Center.

Col. Robinson was commissioned in 1999 through ROTC at the University of North Carolina at Charlotte. He has served in a variety of positions at the Squadron, Wing, Major Command, Headquarters Air Force, and Combatant Command levels. He is a command pilot who has logged over 3,100 hours and deployed in support of Operations Southern Watch, Enduring Freedom, Iraqi Freedom, Inherent Resolve, and Freedom's Sentinel. Prior to his current position, he was the Chief of the Program Integration Division, Headquarters U.S. Air Force, where he was responsible for the development, integration, and evaluation of the Air Force's \$1.1 Trillion budget programed across the Future Years Defense Plan.
