Chief Master Sergeant Noah B. Bliss is the Command Chief Master Sergeant for the 89th Airlift Wing at Joint Base Andrews, Maryland. He is the senior enlisted leader and advisor to the commander on all matters impacting the professional development, readiness, resilience, talent management and effective utilization of the organization's enlisted force. The 89th "SAM Fox" Wing has an exceptionally experienced and ready force of more than 1,200 personnel responsible for global Special Air Mission airlift, logistics, aerial port and communications for the president, vice president, cabinet members, combatant commanders and other senior military and elected leaders as tasked by the White House, Chief of Staff of the Air Force and Air Mobility Command. The wing also operates a Government Network Operations Center and Mission Defense Team, and is home of the Air Force's sole Executive Airlift Training Center.

Chief Master Sergeant Bliss enlisted in the Air Force in 1999. His background includes experience at varying levels in the Communications career field at the squadron, group, and center level. He has also dedicated much of his career to molding our future enlisted leaders as a Military Training Instructor, and several years as a First Sergeant. Chief Master Sergeant Bliss deployed in support of OPERATION IRAQI FREEDOM and OPERATION INHERENT RESOLVE. Most recently, Sergeant Bliss served as the Senior Enlisted Leader for the 729th Air Control Squadron at Hill AFB, Utah.
