CDR A. Scott Angelo **Executive Officer, Naval Air Facility Washington**

CDR Scott Angelo, a native of Brick, N.J., graduated from the University of Maryland, College Park, in 2005 with a Bachelor of Arts and received his commission through the George Washington University Naval Reserve Officer Training Corps. After commissioning, he earned his wings of gold at NAS Corpus Christi, Texas in June 2007.

After Fleet Replacement Squadron training at VP-30 flying the P-3 Orion, his first assignment was to the “Red Lancers” of VP-10 aboard NAS Brunswick, Maine in April 2008. He immediately deployed to Comalapa, El Salvador supporting Operation Caper Focus and Operation Caribbean Shield. In 2009, he deployed to AFRICOM and CENTCOM in support of Operations Iraqi Freedom and Enduring Freedom.



In 2011, CDR Angelo reported to the “Bloodhounds” of VX-30 at Naval Air Warfare Center, Point Mugu, Calif. CDR Angelo served as a Project Officer, the NATOPS Evaluator in the P-3, and a Transport Aircraft Commander in the C-130, supporting countless test evolutions for NASA, Space-X, DARPA, MDA, and other DOD and DON Programs.

In 2015, he reported to the “Condors” of VR-64 aboard Joint Base McGuire-Dix-Lakehurst, N.J., as a Full Time Support Officer. CDR Angelo served as an Instructor Pilot flying the C-130 and supported worldwide fleet logistics to AFRICOM, CENTCOM, EUCOM, and INDOPACOM.

In 2018, CDR Angelo reported to the Joint Chiefs of Staff, J-8, Force Structure, Resources, and Assessment Directorate, Forces Division, Force Assessment Branch. While on the Joint Staff he was responsible for the Joint Force Apportionment Tables portfolio and was integral in various assessments, projects, and studies involving force availability, readiness, and Joint Force medical composition.

In 2020, CDR Angelo assumed command of Navy Operational Support Command Milwaukee, where he was responsible for maintaining the warfighting readiness for 140 Selected Reservists in five units. The command was disestablished in 2021 after a 104 year Navy Reserve presence in the city of Milwaukee.

CDR Angelo has accumulated over 2,500 flight hours and is the recipient of various personal decorations and campaign medals and has had the distinct honor of serving with shipmates and on teams who were awarded the Joint Meritorious Unit Award and the Navy Battle “E” Ribbon. He earned his Master’s in National Security and Strategic Studies from the US Naval War College and a Master’s in Business Administration from University of North Carolina Chapel Hill Kenan-Flagler Business School.
