BACKGROUND

The Davidsonville Dumping Area (AOC-28) is located approximately 2,000 feet east of the western Davidsonville Transmitter Site boundary and is accessible by the public. Several piles of miscellaneous debris (scrap metal, wood, construction debris, and domestic rubbish) were disposed of at the site between 1986 and 1990. No evidence of dumping hazardous household or industrial materials was observed. General removal of the trash and debris was recommended.

A Preliminary Assessment/Site Investigation (PA/SI) was completed in 2005 to determine whether environmental impacts exist at the site. The PA/SI report recommended no further action at AOC-28. Civil Engineering performed a removal of surface debris in July 2005, and a no further action memorandum was issued in August 2005.

The investigation and cleanup of the site have been completed.




Figure 1: AOC-28 Site Location Map (Source: URS 2003)
