

Formerly known as Andrews Air Force Base, Joint Base Andrews - NAF Washington (JBA) has operated as a joint base since 2010.

Hosted by the United States Air Force's 11th Wing, JBA is comprised of more than 80 distinct organizations, including the 89th Airlift Wing (which provides airlift and logistics support worldwide for the President and Vice President of the United States, Cabinet members and other high-ranking U.S. and foreign government officials) as well as Army, Navy, Marine Corps, Air Force Reserve and National Guard units. The 11th Wing also oversees operations for the Air Force Band, Honor Guard and Chaplaincy, headquartered at Joint Base Anacostia-Bolling.

Joint Base Andrews and its surrounding communities support each other, work together and are growing collectively. That's why the base was recently named the top Air Force base in the Department of Defense by winning the 2015 Commander in Chief Installation Excellence Award.

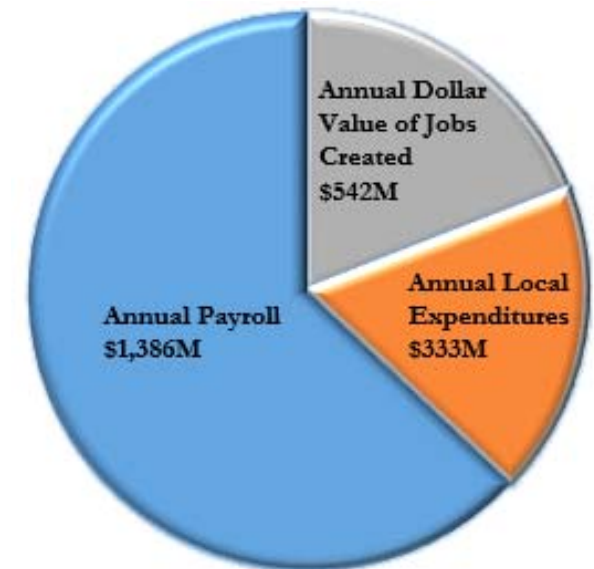
